Fazle Mahmud Rabbi is a seasoned batting all-rounder who has been a consistent force in Bangladesh's domestic cricket scene for over two decades. A top-order left-handed batter and a handy slow left-arm spinner, Rabbi has built a formidable career since making his List A debut in January 2004.

Over the course of more than 320 professional matches, he has amassed nearly 12,000 runs across formats, showcasing a remarkable level of consistency and durability. His first-class average of 32.59 and an even more impressive 37.42 in List A cricket are testaments to his quality at the crease. With 21 centuries to his name across red and white-ball formats, Rabbi has long been regarded as one of the most reliable and prolific run-scorers in Bangladesh's domestic circuit.

While his batting has been the cornerstone of his career, Rabbi's left-arm spin has provided valuable support throughout. He has claimed 68 wickets with career-best figures of 4 for 55 in first-class and 3 for 18 in List A cricket – proof of his ability to contribute meaningfully with the ball when required.

Despite dominating at domestic level, Rabbi's international career was limited to just two ODIs, both against Zimbabwe in 2018. His national call-up came off the back of a strong tour to Ireland with the Bangladesh A team, where his performances with the bat caught the selectors' attention. Although he didn't get an extended run in the national setup, he has remained a powerhouse in the domestic game.

Post-COVID, Rabbi's form has gone from strength to strength, particularly in List A cricket. His recent seasons include tallies of 537 runs at 48.81 (2021/22), a stunning 863 runs at 53.93 (2022/23), 492 runs at 32.80 (2023/24), and 381 runs at 34.63 (2024/25) including four centuries in that period alone. These numbers highlight his enduring class and ability to anchor innings or accelerate when needed.

Now looking to broaden his horizons, Rabbi is targeting his first overseas club stint in the UK for the 2026 season. Backed by glowing endorsements — including from former Bangladesh captain Mohammad Ashraful and national selector Habibul Bashar, who labelled him the "complete package" - Rabbi shapes as a high-value signing. With elite-level experience, proven run-scoring pedigree, and the added bonus of his left-arm spin, he would be a major asset for any club seeking a calm, consistent, and high-performing overseas professional.
