Georgia Atkinson is an exciting prospect and stand-out performer for the Central Districts Hinds in New Zealand domestic cricket.

Despite her age (25), Atkinson has already featured in nearly 150 matches for the Hinds across both List A (Hallyburton Johnston Shield) and T20 (Dream 11 Women's Super Smash) competitions.

Atkinson made her Hinds debut in November 2017, and until recently, was used as a leg spinner who batted in the middle order. However, in recent times she has flourished in her new role batting alongside White Ferns star Natalie Dodd at the top of the order. In January 2023, the pair broke New Zealand's T20 opening partnership record hitting 112 against champions' Wellington, with Atkinson bringing up her maiden half-century (50).

A destructive batter who strikes the ball in unorthodox areas, Atkinson is also known for her wrist spin. She boasts impressive white ball numbers, particularly in List A cricket with 49 poles at 25.83 all with an economy rate of 4.79.

Atkinson has long been touted for international honours. She was Central District's MVP and top run-scorer at the National U18 tournament and represented the New Zealand Development side in 2019.

Previewing the Hinds ahead of this summer's Super Smash, Jeet Vachharajani stated:

"She is one of the most exciting players for me to watch in this team [Hinds]. A very interesting wrist-spinner who has got all the funky shots in her armory. Hinds recently had to use her at the death in a rain-curtailed HBJ game and she did an incredible job".

Alongside her playing skills, Atkinson holds a Bachelor of Sport and Exercise degree and is an accredited and practicing NZC level 1 coach, currently working her way through her level 2. She is not only keen to develop her own game, in a view to breaking into the White Ferns but help others.

A fantastic prospect, Atkinson has also featured abroad, with stints in Ireland - (Rush Cricket Club in 2023), and England (Cheltenham Cricket Club in 2024). For the latter, playing in the West of England Women's Premier League she impressed hitting 605 runs at 35.59 alongside 13 wickets at 22.38.

Given her success the club were quick to re-sign their kiwi star for a second stint in 2025.
