Harsh Vikram Singh is a seasoned seam-bowling all-rounder currently representing Bihar in Indian domestic cricket. Now in his early 30s, Singh brings a wealth of experience to the field as a sharp opening bowler and powerful lower-middle order batter, with over 30 domestic appearances across formats.

Singh made his first-class debut in the Ranji Trophy back in 2018, featuring in two matches before a break in play. He returned to the Bihar setup following the COVID-19 hiatus and played a key role in the team's 2022/23 Plate Group Ranji Trophy title-winning campaign, underlining his value as a seasoned campaigner in the squad.

A standout in domestic circles, Singh's skills have also been recognised at the highest level—selected as a net bowler for two IPL franchises: the Rajasthan Royals (2020) and Delhi Capitals (2021). His ability to consistently hit good areas with the new ball, combined with his finishing power with the bat, makes him a reliable and versatile asset in any format.

Off the field, Singh is a passionate and active cricket coach. He currently runs two successful cricket academies, employing four full-time coaches, and mentoring the next generation of players. His long-term ambition is to transition into coaching full-time, a goal that is already well underway thanks to his leadership and hands-on experience.

In 2026, Singh is targeting his maiden UK club cricket stint, where he aims to contribute both as a high-impact player and a qualified coach. With a strong professional background, IPL exposure, and a coaching mindset, Harsh Vikram

Note: Looking ahead Vikram Singh is targeting a return to the Ranji Trophy during the 2025/26 season. To ensure his eligibility for UK club cricket in 2026 under current ECB criteria (requiring 5 first-class matches in the last 36 months), he must play at least one Ranji Trophy match prior to 13 December 2025. Should he miss this window, he would need to feature in 3-4 additional first-class matches during the upcoming winter to remain eligible.
