Kelis Ndhlovu is one of Zimbabwe's brightest cricketing stars - a dynamic all-rounder whose impact on women's cricket has been both consistent and commanding. Renowned for her composure under pressure and ability to influence games with both bat and ball, she has swiftly risen to prominence on the domestic and international stage.

Her talent earned global recognition in April 2023 when she was shortlisted for the ICC's "Player of the Month," a testament to her growing stature in the sport. This followed a string of dominant performances, most notably being named "Player of the Tournament" in the 2022/23 T20 season, where she also starred in both tournament finals — earning "Player of the Match" honours in the T20 final (Eagles vs Rhinos) and the Fifty50 final (Eagles vs Mountaineers).

This wasn't a one-off. Ndhlovu had already claimed the "Player of the Tournament" title in the 2021/22 T20 season, and was also crowned "Batter of the Tournament" for her consistent top-order performances. She continued her fine form in individual matches, regularly stepping up in key encounters — including match-winning efforts for the Eagles against both the Mountaineers and the Tuskers.

Not just a force with the bat, Ndhlovu's bowling prowess came to the fore during the 2022/23 Fifty50 season, where she was named "Bowler of the Tournament," highlighting her ability to turn games with the ball just as effectively.

On the international stage, she's already proven her match-winning quality — notably in the 2022 ICC Women's T20 World Cup Qualifier, where she was named "Player of the Match" against Thailand, and again in the playoff against the

UAE.

With accolades piling up and a growing reputation as a game-changer, Ndhlovu is now eager to test herself abroad — eyeing a UK club stint in 2026, alongside future franchise league opportunities around the world.
