Noor Ali Zadran is a legend of Afghanistan cricket, who helped guide his country from the lower reaches of the World Cricket League to ODI status.

He spent over a decade with the national side, following his debut against Saudi Arabia in the 2006 Middle East Cup. A high-class batter, Zadran was an influential figure in Afghanistan's rapid rise from WCL Division 5 to Division 2 (2008-09) and the Super Eights of the 2009 ICC World Cup Qualifiers.

Afghanistan gained ODI status, and Zadran would go on to hit 45 on debut against Scotland in April 2009. The following year, he played in the 2010 ICC World T20, before making a century (114) against Canada in the Intercontinental Cup.

Over the past decade, Zadran has played 2 Tests, 51 ODI's and 23 T20I's for his country, with averages of 29.25, 24.81, and 27.13, respectively. His two Tests for Afghanistan have come recently against Sri Lanka (February 2024), and Ireland (March 2024), hitting notable scores of 31 and 47 (v Sri Lanka), and 32 (v Ireland).

Zadran is a fantastic performer, who is now eager to play in Franchise cricket around the globe since his recent international retirement.
