Rohan Prem is widely regarded as one of Kerala's greatest cricketers, a seasoned performer whose career has been defined by consistency, longevity, and a string of remarkable achievements. Starting his cricket journey at the age of nine, Rohan has gone on to become the most decorated player in Kerala's history, leaving an indelible mark across all formats of the game.

He holds the distinction of being the first Kerala player to score over 5,000 runs in Ranji Trophy cricket, and with 5,479 runs from 102 first-class matches, including 13 centuries at an average of 38, he is Kerala's all-time leading run-scorer. His record-breaking run includes the most centuries and appearances for the state, underlining his unmatched influence. With the ball, his off-spin has proven valuable, claiming 53 wickets at 35.45 in Ranji cricket.

Throughout his career, Rohan has been a standout presence, earning accolades such as Kerala Cricket Association's Best Cricketer (2016), Player of the Year (2005), Best Batsman (2009), and Best All-Rounder (2007/08). He has delivered match-winning performances against top domestic sides including Goa, Andhra, Himachal Pradesh, Hyderabad, Services, and Tripura, collecting numerous Man of the Match awards in Ranji Trophy, Vijay Hazare Trophy, and Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy contests.

Rohan's milestones are equally impressive—he was the first Kerala player to score centuries at every age-group level, the second-youngest to reach 1,000 first-class runs for the state, and has scored over 1,000 runs as a Ranji Trophy captain. He also became only the third Indian to cross the 1,000-run mark in the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy and remains

the highest run-scorer for Kerala across all formats.

Now retired from Indian domestic cricket, Rohan Prem is ready to bring his wealth of experience and proven pedigree to the UK in 2026, where he hopes to make a significant impact in league cricket and continue inspiring the next generation of cricketers.
