Fielding has also become one of his key strengths. Operating in key positions such as point, cover, and gully, Masekesa is widely regarded as one of the best fielders in Zimbabwe. His sharp reflexes and commitment to the game are evident every time he steps onto the field, and he takes immense pride in his fielding prowess.

As vice-captain of the Mountaineers, Masekesa has proven his leadership skills, guiding the team to significant success. In 2024, he helped lead the Mountaineers to victory in the prestigious Logan Cup, Zimbabwe's top-tier first-class competition, following their List A triumph in 2022. These team successes are a testament to his growing influence and his ability to inspire his teammates.

Looking ahead, Masekesa harbors strong ambitions of representing Zimbabwe at the international level. His upward trajectory suggests that he is on the right path, and his commitment to improving his batting and continuing to hone his leg spin makes him a player to watch in the coming years. As he continues to develop both with the bat and the ball, Masekesa is positioning himself to be a key player for Zimbabwe in the future, a player who brings more than just his primary skillset to the table.
